WOMEN'S ACHIEVEMENT IN INFRASTRUCTURE **AWARD**

Recognises the achievements of a woman who has made a significant contribution to a project or transaction completed in 2019, had an important role in developing policy or research, or demonstrated exceptional management or leadership skills.



FUTURE INFRASTRUCTURE LEADER OF THE YEAR AWARD

Recognises a person under the age of 35, who has made an outstanding contribution to the infrastructure sector.

PROJECT AWARDS



Martin Place Integrated Station Development

Advisory Excellence

Recognises excellence in advisory services on major infrastructure projects - qualifying disciplines include: engineering, design, financial, legal and policy advice.



Financial Excellence

Recognises exceptional advice and/or innovation in the financing or structuring of a major infrastructure project.



ast year's winner: The Caulfield to Dandenong Level Removal Crossing Project

Government **Partnerships Excellence**

Recognises excellence in the delivery of infrastructure through a genuine partnership between government and the private sector, using this partnership to overcome problems or to propose solutions and innovation.



Last year's winner: Wentworth to Broken Hill Pineline

Contractor **Excellence**

Recognises exceptional work completed by a contractor including achievement of time, safety and quality objectives.



Last year's winner: Taswater for the Regional Towns Water Supply

Operator & Service Provider Excellence

Recognises excellence in the delivery of services or management of operations of a major infrastructure asset.



Power Supply For Melbourne's Railway Signalling Network

Innovation Excellence

Recognises innovation in a major infrastructure project or service. This may be through the use of technology, intelligent engineering, system optimisation, modernization, or disruption.

The coveted Project of the Year Award recognises a major, transformational infrastructure project that has been exceptional across the all phases of delivery.

About the awards

The project awards celebrate the success of Australia and New Zealand's infrastructure projects, across eight categories. To qualify, the project must be an Australian or New Zealand project completed (or partially completed) in 2019.

What you'll need

- Official project name and details including, procurement, delivery and budgeting information
- List of project participants including, proponents and consortia parties, clients, financial advisers, legal advisers, financiers, other advisers, contractors/constructors
- Three images of the project

The application process

Step 1.

Select nomination category/categories

Select your category or categories. A project can be nominated for multiple award categories within the same nomination form.

Step 2.

Who contributed to the project and in what way?

List all the participants involved in the delivery of the project. The judging panel will determine which organisation(s) will be recognised depending on their role and involvement in the project. Please note that not all participants in awarded projects will be acknowledged depending on the category.

Step 3.

Project background and details

Fill in basic information about the project including, status, timelines and costs of the project.

Step 4.

Tell us why this project deserves to win

Provide further information on the innovative, unique and exceptional components of the project.

Step 5.

Short project description and images

Write a 150-word summary of the project. Attach three high quality images for each project nomination. We use this in marketing collateral featuring winners and finalists of the award.

Step 6.

Contact information for this nomination

Give the best point of contact for the nomination, a referee for the project and the best person to receive the award on the night.

Step 7.

Review and submit!

What you'll need

- The nominees contact details

- General information on the nominee's contribution to the sector and a specific example that highlights their achievements
- · Contact details of two referees

Outline the contribution of the nominee to the sector and provide a specific example detailing their achievements.

What you'll need

- A specific example where the nominee demonstrated a significant contribution to a project or transaction completed in 2019, had an important role in developing policy or research, or demonstrated exceptional management or leadership skills
- · Contact details for two referees

The application process

Step 1.

Nomination and contact details

Provide contact details and a short biography of the nominee. You can nominate someone else or yourself.

Step 2.

Significant achievements

Outline a specific example of the nominee's achievements and provide an overview of how the they embody a future infrastructure leader.

Step 3. Referees

Please provide two referees to support the nomination.
